## RONALD GREELEY EARLY CAREER AWARD IN PLANETARY SCIENCE

Established in 2012, the Ronald Greeley Early Career Award in Planetary Science is given annually to one honoree (no more than 6 years post-degree) in recognition of significant early career contributions to planetary science. This award is named in honor of AGU Fellow, Ronald Greeley for his influential contributions made to training and mentoring planetary scientists.

#### WHIPPLE AWARD

Established in 1989, the Whipple Award is given annually to one honoree in recognition of outstanding contributions in the field of planetary science. This award is named in honor of AGU Fellow, Fred Whipple, a gifted astronomer most noted for his work on comets. The Whipple Award includes an opportunity to present an invited lecture during the AGU Fall Meeting, held in San Francisco, Calif. The Whipple Lecture is webcast and made available as an archived presentation on the AGU website.

## AMERICAN GEOPHYSICAL UNION FELLOWS

This honor is given to individual AGU members who have made exceptional scientific contributions and attained acknowledged eminence in the fields of Earth and space sciences. Since the establishment of the AGU Fellows program in 1962, and in accordance with AGU bylaws, no more than 0.1 percent of the total membership of AGU is recognized annually.

Fellows nomination deadline is 15 March 2016.

# Lloyd V. Berkner Space Policy Internships Summer 2016

The goal of the <u>Lloyd V. Berkner Space Policy Internship</u> is to provide promising students with the opportunity to work in the area of civil space research policy in the nation's capital, under the aegis of the Space Science Board of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine. The summer 2016 program is only open to undergraduates. The deadline for applications is February 5. Candidate(s) selected for will be contacted no later than March 4. #### **GEOPATH: Inclusive Field-Based Geoscience Undergraduate Research Opportunities for Everyone!**

James Madison University is leading an accessible geoscience field studies program offering opportunities for students with various mobile abilities to collaborate in an inclusive field-based environment, regardless of physical ability. In the first year, you will participate in an end-of-semester active research project at exciting geological field sites, including the Grand Canyon, the Barringer Meteorite Crater, and the San Francisco Volcanic Field. In year 2017, you will participate fully, regardless of mobility, in an accessible expedition to multiple sites in western Ireland. All participating students will receive a \$1,000 stipend for each of the two years of the project, along with travel funds to all of the field sites. ## **Giving to the AGU Planetary Science Section**

If you're considering end-of-year giving, please consider your AGU section! AGU recently announced a new member giving incentive program that could provide up to \$5000 in unrestricted funding to our Planetary Sciences section. The program payouts are based on the rate of participation of primarily affiliated members (excluding students) to our section. If we have 5% of our primarily affiliated members make a contribution of \$50 or greater, AGU will provide us with \$1000 in unrestricted funding; \$2000 for 7% rate of participation; \$3000 for 10% rate of participation; \$4000 for 12% rate of participation; and \$5000 for 15% rate of participation. Only members who make contributions of \$50 or greater will qualify. Contributions can be made to <u>ANY AGU FUND</u>. Your financial contribution to AGU will demonstrate your commitment to the Earth and space sciences while potentially generating additional unrestricted revenue for our section. Please strongly consider this request as we set our sights for a 15% rate of participation!
