4) An additional planetary newsletter

A new newsletter has been started through the efforts of several planetary scientists. The Planetary Exploration Newsletter (PEN) is a weekly electronic mailing that is intended to be an open conduit of news and announcements across the entire planetary science community (e.g., astronomers, planetary scientists, astrobiologists, geologists, atmospheric scientists and others doing planetary research). The desire is to cut across the boundaries of existing electronic newsletters to increase interdisciplinary awareness and distribute information of broad professional interest. PEN will contain messages from NASA and other officials, meeting announcements from professional societies, job announcements, and your submissions of news regarding or impacting solar system exploration, upcoming mission events, awards, Congressional deliberations on the NASA budget, policy issues, and assessments of program performance. There will be times when volume or events will require more frequent PEN distributions.

An editorial board has been established that is open to representatives of professional societies, research organizations, and academic departments engaged in planetary science. This is to ensure the broadest possible participation, set policy and offer guidance to the editor, Mark Sykes (Planetary Science Institute, Tucson).
